Syllabus Training in AEFIS: Summer Syllabi are Available to be Reviewed and Published

The Offices of Undergraduate Education and Institutional Research and Assessment will be offering several live webinar trainings coming up in May on reviewing and publishing summer syllabi. **All syllabi must be published 2 weeks after the first day of classes each term. Therefore, for our Summer Terms syllabi must be published by June 7th.** Please note that the AEFIS system will automatically publish all syllabi 3 weeks after the first day of classes.

Summer 2021 Syllabi are available in AEFIS now. Training is available for course coordinators and instructors. Be aware, if there is a course coordinator defined for a course they must go in at the course level first and publish all of the common text for the syllabus. Once the course coordinator publishes, then the instructor must go in at the course section level to add what they need to the syllabus and then publish at the instructor level. Below are several syllabus training date opportunities for both the course coordinator and instructor roles:

- 5/11/2021 from 2 – 3pm
- 5/17/2021 from 9 – 10am
- 5/25/2021 from 2 – 3pm
- 6/2/2021 from 1 – 2pm
