We are very excited to welcome our guest speaker, <u>Christopher Dede</u>, who is a Senior Research Fellow at Harvard's Graduate School of Education. The session will look at how we and our children face a world-wide interdependent civilization shaped by economic turbulence from artificial intelligence and globalization, climate change, and advanced social and immersive media. Higher/continuing educators are faced with the challenge of preparing young people—and current workers--for unceasing reinvention to take on many roles in the workplace, as well as for careers that do not yet exist. This presentation will focus on The Sixty Year Curriculum initiative, which centers on the least understood aspect of this challenge: What are the organizational and societal mechanisms by which people can reskill both through higher/continuing education and later in their lives, when they do not have the time or resources for a full-time academic experience that results in a degree or certificate? Using combinations of these can create impactful educational experiences. This two-day symposium offers invited talks by field experts, panel discussions with Rensselaer community members, and workshops for creating, curating, and facilitating these types of learning experiences.
